The Center is located on the south end of the FPC campus, next to the rodeo arena, and is home to the FPC cattle herd, which includes two Red Angus donor cows and two bull calves from the Collier Diamond C Ranch at Stephenville, Texas.

The facility and program are made possible by donations from the Borger Economic Development Corporation, Borger Chamber of Commerce (Tourism), City of Borger, Agrium, and Monsanto.

FPC agriculture classes are held in the facility and livestock embryo services are available to the public.
