Advisory Council Meeting
2016-2017 4th Quarter Meeting Minutes
Wednesday, July 26, 2017

Members Attending: Barry Willis, Miguel Valenzuela, Diane Thorp, Minta Wilson, Shae Cunningham, Robert Hall, Kerry Symons, Earl McKinley, Dean Amber Jones and Dr. Jud Hicks.

Old Business: Dean Amber Jones furnished the committee with the Pathways update. The fundraiser netted \$3300 and the hope is to continue the fundraisers to help make Pathways self-sustaining in the future. Amber informed the group that the first Perryton Pathways seniors are now enrolling for college and that approximately half current dual credit students are taking advantage of Pathways to help with funding their dual credit costs.

New Business: Dean Jones presented the committee her goals for the Allen campus; she hopes to increase on-campus headcount by 10%, dual credit headcount by 5% and continuing education headcount by 10%. To facilitate those numbers she will continue to be more involved with the community, will utilize social media more and will remain active in community events. She will seek to provide educational opportunities for the Perryton area, continue to increase course offerings at the college, work with other entities in Perryton to initiate an RN program, a cosmetology program and expand safety training opportunities to local businesses. The college will continue to work with the Pathways director and group to help develop and expand that program in order to help more of our Perryton students. The college has the following courses implemented and/or planned for this school year: I&E (Instrumental and Electrical) which can be used in an applied science certification; TCOLE training which is needed by peace officers and emergency room personnel, water management courses which are needed by all communities; GED and ESL classes; Phlebotomy and Anatomy and Physiology I and II; the LVN programs and OSHA safety training opportunities.

Dean Jones also presented the proposed budget for 2017-2018. The budget was discussed and compared to the 2016-2017 budget. County Judge Earl McKinley added details about the county budget hearing and plans were made for that event.

Dean Jones presented the 4th quarter wrap-up for the Allen campus which shows our enrollment down by 23%. Reasons for that decrease were presented and discussed. There are already approximately 70 students enrolled for the fall term.

The Advisory Council terms of office were discussed and replacement council member names were proposed.
