The lack of adequately trained personnel to care for the sick constitutes a grave health and community problem. In the Panhandle of Texas, in the state, and in the nation, an immediate need for nurses is acute. This challenge is the motivating force behind the establishment of the Frank Phillips College Vocational Nursing Program.

In 2017, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics projected the licensed vocational nurse profession will grow by 16% by 2024. The BLS estimates 117,300 skilled professionals are needed by 2024 as the population ages and chronic conditions increase.

A busy and challenging career awaits you as a nurse. You will be prepared to function as a vital member of the health care team. Once you are a nurse, your services will be in immediate demand now as well as for years to come.

Frank Phillips College is a rural, comprehensive community college. APPLICATION PROCESS

VOCATIONAL NURSING

The Frank Phillips College Vocational Nursing Program is a 12-month program dedicated to the preparation of valuable members of the healthcare team, both male and female, who will share in the care of the sick and in the prevention of illness under the direction of a licensed physician and/or registered nurse.

Upon completion of the program, students are eligible to take the NCLEXPN Examination. After successfully passing the examination, the graduates receive a license to practice as a Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN).

Jointly approved by the Texas Board of Nursing and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, the Frank Phillips College Vocational Nursing Program is also part of a transition program in cooperation with Amarillo College and West Texas A&M University.

This system allows students to use courses taken in the Vocational Nursing Program as credit toward an Associates Degree or Bachelor's Degree in Nursing. Through this collaboration, students are able to transition into Registered Nurse training.
