## Historic Canadian Texas

A stroll across the Canadian River Historic Wagon Bridge will be a lovely way to start your adventure. This steel structure was built in 1915 by the Canton Bridge Company of Ohio. Completed in 1916, it stretched 2,635 feet. In 1924 an addition was needed to span a new flood channel on the north side. The bridge then became the longest steel structure west of the Mississippi at 3,255 feet. Today the planked bridge, spanning river and wetlands area, is a favorite for those walking, bicycling, jogging, bird watching and nature viewing.

CANADIAN'S CULTURAL DISTRICT is home to thirty four historically significant buildings, residences, and churches which visitors may enjoy on self guided tours.

One example is the Palace Theatre, built in au1909 as a vdeville theatre now completely

restored in the Art Deco style. Completed in 1910, the three story brick Moody Hotel on Main was the first fireproof hotel in the Panhandle. The lobby features the original staircase, photos, and period pieces.

WCTU Building which houses our County Library was the only building in the US ever built, owned, or maintained by a local chapter of the Women's Christian Temperance Union. Canadian's First Church Bell was purchased in 1890 with funds raised from church goers from several different denominations. The bell can be heard today at the Presbyterian Church.


