Student Rights

As a student consumer, you have the right to know:

- <u>Financial aid availability</u> and resources to students from all federal, state, and institutional financial assistance programs.
- Federal loans borrowed by the student or parent will be reported to the National Student Loan Database System (NSLDS), and will be accessible by guaranty agencies, lenders, and schools determined to be authorized users of the data system. Students can access this information by logging into their account on <u>studentaid.gov</u>.
- The deadlines, selection criteria, eligibility requirements, terms, policies, procedures, and regulations that apply to each of the programs, starting with <u>applying for financial</u> <u>aid</u>.
- How financial need is determined.
- How and when student <u>account refunds</u> are processed.
- The <u>satisfactory academic progress</u> standards a student must maintain to remain eligible for financial assistance and the criteria by which a student who has failed to maintain the satisfactory academic progress standards may re-establish eligibility for financial assistance.
- The terms of any loan received by a student as a part of the student's financial assistance package, a sample loan repayment schedule for a student loan and the necessity for repaying loans.
- The terms and conditions applicable to <u>student employment</u> provided as part of a financial aid package.
- The college's <u>withdrawal policy</u>, including the requirements and procedures for officially withdrawing from the school.
- A summary of the requirements for the <u>return of title IV</u> grant or loan funds.

Student Responsibilities

As a student consumer, it is your responsibility to:

- Understand and comply with the terms and conditions of aid you receive.
- Use financial aid funds only for education expenses (tuition, fees, housing, meals, transportation, books, course materials, supplies, equipment, and other living costs).
- Know and meet the deadlines to apply and reapply for financial aid annually.
- Respond promptly to all requests for supplemental information or documentation from Frank Phillips College.
- Complete all financial assistance applications and forms with thorough and accurate information and return them promptly.
- Notify Student Financial Services if there is any change to the information you reported on the FAFSA or TASFA.
- Notify Student Financial Services if there are any changes to your enrollment status or level and understand the impact that dropping a course or withdrawing from the college may have on your student financial aid.

- Notify the Student Financial Services office if you receive any grants, scholarships, or other financial assistance from sources outside Frank Phillips College.
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress to continue to be eligible for financial aid.
- Know and comply with college refund and withdrawal policies.
- Know and comply with the federal, state, and institutional rules governing the financial aid you receive.
- Complete entrance counseling, a master promissory note, and exit counseling if you receive a Federal Direct Student Loan.
- Notify your lender of any changes in your name, address, or school status while you are attending school and after you leave school.
- Repay any student loans you receive regardless of whether you successfully completed your program.
- Perform the work agreed upon if accept a work-study award.
